

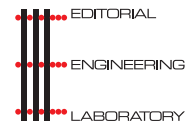

Editorial Engineering Laboratory(EEL) was established in 1987 to publish History Informs in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of NTT's telephone business. As a research institution providing pilot models for the information age, EEL has been involved in digital media development and the planning of forums and publications.

EEL launched the **ISIS Edit School** in 2000. Students range from junior high school students to housewives, engineers, business managers, and artists, creating a unique network that includes many talented people with "Online coaching skills."

"The director of the institute is **Seigow Matsuoka**, who has written and appeared on television extensively with regard to Japanese culture. The Renjuku presentations he has organized since 2003 have been popular among people from all walks of life who are interested in learning about Japan.

Senya Sensatsu (1000books, 1000nights.)

Seigow Matsuoka's extremely popular Web site in which he introduces one book every day. The selected books and the methods of making limitless use of the knowledge contained in books are popular topics of conversation, and the site has grown to approximately 1.25 million page views (May 2006). A printed compilation of the entire series was published in autumn 2006.

ISIS Edit School

An online school for learning techniques for editing information, from collection to distribution. The school is headed by Seigow Matsuoka. The proprietary curriculum is called "Henshu Keiko (Editing Practice)," students study in small groups ("Communities"), and are taught by "Shihan-dai (Net Coaches)". The program has a high completion rate at more than 70%, and has been recognized as an example of successful e-learning. More than 300 classes have already been formed.
